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Admission Process (For new students)

Step 1: (this application process is for students who have never enrolled Golden Hills International Programs)

Please submit the application here. The following will be required to submit online application.

- The non-refundable, Registration Fee \$250.00
- Attested transcripts of achievement for the past three years of school. Transcripts must be submitted in English.
- A copy of your Passport or photocopy of government issued or internationally recognized photo identification.
- Completed and signed FOIP
- A Letter of intent- stating why you wish to study online with Golden Hills and your long-term academic goals (one-page maximum).
- TOEFL, IELTS, or any recognized English Proficiency results if completed.

Step 2:

Once online application has been submitted, a student will be received English online test instruction (from grade 7-12 program)

Step 3:

We will determine which courses the student will be most successful in and issue an invoice accordingly.

Step 4:

Student will receive log in information for the online course after receipt of payment. This will allow the student to begin their studies.

FAQ-1

How many courses can I take?

We recommend that students take 2 core courses/semester and 1-2 option courses.

How long does each course last?

The great thing about online learning is that it's organized to fit the learners schedule. The student can work as fast or as slow as they wish. Courses do however have assignment completion dates attached to them.

If I find a course too easy (difficult), am I able to change?

Yes within the 2 week time period.

How do I monitor if my child is doing OK?

You will have access to PowerSchool upon your request.

How do final exams for grade 10 and 11 work?

Students write their final exams online with dates and times determined by the students and the teacher.

Are online courses more or less difficult compared to courses taught in regular classes in school?

The curriculum is the same for both. Teachers have to follow the same curriculum outcomes as outlined by Alberta Education whether you are studying in a classroom or online in your home.

Are there tests/examinations? If there are, how do I write them? Do I have to go to Canada to write tests/exams or can I write them online?

There are tests which are written throughout the course. Final exams are done at the end of each semester. Grade 10 and 11 students can write these exams online. Teachers and students set up the dates and times the writing will take place.

What kinds of materials are being used? Is there audio/video materials?

Students are provided with online version of textbooks, novels and tutorials for their courses. These include audio/video materials.

Is there a teacher who monitors my progress and to whom I can ask questions?

Yes there is a teacher monitoring your progress at all times. You can always connect with the teacher via email, google classroom/hangout, zoom, etc to ask your questions.

Can I receive help in deciding which courses to take?

Yes. Our Academic Advisor will review your transcripts from your previous school, look over your ESL pre-assessment and make suggestions to you.

Is it possible to mingle with other students who are taking the same course as I online?

Yes. Forums and hangouts are created for this purpose.

Is it possible to earn 100 credits required for AB High School Diploma all through online learning (without physically attending regular classes at school)?

Yes it is possible. You would need to be present in house to write all of your diploma exams in Grade 12 though.
