The recently developed pleasant new residential area has been well developed as a place where you can enjoy the intimacy of small towns and the convenience of large cities at the same time.



Fully Managed Dormitory

This program is a fully managed dormitory program for students of Golden Hills.. This Global Leader Program is differentiated curriculum that aims to improve school life and improve the quality of the students by improving the quality of English and living in the dormitory.

This is a managed program that is run directly by the public education office.



English Immersion Environment



Canada's public schools obtains world's highest public education system.

Students will take regular classes just like Canadian students. Creates perfect English immersion environment as school cirriculam programs are conducted in small schools. Each school offers ESL classes for new students, and depending on students English levels, they will be joining in regular classes.

Canadian Buddy (elementary and Junior HIgh students) will be assigned to fit into the Canadian School and friendships.

Self Directed Learning

Korean and Canadian supervisors manage students' afterschool education and daily life education to improve socializing skills.

Through meetings with individual students on academic and daily life, we set goals for learning, improve student's lifestyle, and encourage students to read books, study english and math skills, . These are very helpful in solving problems on their own, and they are a natural ingredient in the global era of globalization.

- The time for volunteering is included in the performance evaluation and a letter of recommendation will be issued by the education office for future references.







- Advice on eye contacts, gesture, voice, skills, informations, and logics
- Record video and send it to parents (1 video per semester)
